I apologised in 2020 for including this deal from the final as the only hand in an abbreviated final bulletin, but at least Nabil will be happy with me for reposting it!

#### Board 7, South deals, all vulnerable



4♠ is the normal opening bid by any experienced South, and an initial thought by West is to enter the auction, either by bidding 5♦ or doubling (primarily takeout, and implying heart tolerance.)

The decision to double cost heavily for the DON West. As can perhaps be expected, partner bid 5 + and West converted to 5 + .

After this was doubled, East corrected to  $5 \checkmark$ , doubled by Sophie Ashton, South. When this came back to East, the correction was to  $6 \clubsuit$ , doubled and -1400, when the defence was merciless and declarer had a difficult guess in the endgame.

All with  $4 \triangleq$  going down! Nabil's reasoned decision to pass  $4 \triangleq$  at the other table led to 17 IMPs on the deal.
