them all and realise he had a 25 count! Happy to have such a good hand he opened the bidding with a game forcing 2C and was a bit shocked when his partner, the Easter Bunny responded with a natural and positive 3D

Father Xmas had 4 diamonds so showed his support and Easter Bunny wheeled out Blackwood. Perhaps worn out by counting his high card points Father Xmas holding 3 aces mistakenly showed 4 and was concerned when Easter Bunny promptly chose a 7NT bid.

Tooth Fairy in the pass-out seat looked confused and after a concerned pause eventually passed. Mary Poppins on opening lead chose a neutral diamond. Dummy was tabled and, in a disgust laden tone Easter Bunny called for a low diamond. The Tooth Fairy produced the ace of diamonds and Easter Bunny promptly claimed 1 off.

"You showed 4 aces and you only had three!" screeched Easter Bunny.

"I guess I just miscounted" responded an embarrassed Father Xmas.

Easter Bunny made little attempt to hide his anger and as he sorted his cards for the next hand, he could be heard furiously muttering and at various points using the words "fat" "pompous" and "wanker"

A recorder is chosen because they are someone with expertise in resolving disputes between players and dealing appropriately with bad behaviour from players. Approach a recorder and report any Easter Bunny type behaviour or indeed any behaviour that lowers the high standards expected from all participants.
