After 12 of 14 Qualifying matches there are only two matches to go to determine who will be the two finalists in each division.

- In the Open Vic and SA are well ahead of WA in third place and are likely to be the finalists.
- In the Women's SA have a substantial lead but Vic and NSW are very close and should fight it out for second place. Vic have to play the first and third teams in the last two rounds.
- NSW are leading the Seniors but not by a large margin. SA and Qld are nearly identical for second place but if one had two big matches they could even overtake NSW. SA has to play the two leading teams
- In the Youth Vic are well ahead but again SA and Qld will be fighting it out.

It also comes down to the draw and whether teams are playing against other teams above or below them.
