DAVES' DAILY: Pre-empting at Favourable Vulnerability

I have changed my mind about pre-empting non-vulnerable!

Up until recently, I advocated a solid style, which could be a little looser if not vulnerable but was essentially constructive. However, recent hands have demonstrated the effectiveness of a "destructive" bid in 1st seat not vul.

In match 12 yesterday of the interstate teams, Therese de Marco held the following in first chair:

\$T9854

v83

♦Q8743

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Therese opened 2♠ which showed 5♠ and 4 of a minor.

Her LHO passed and her partner bid 3♣, pass or correct. This bid asked the opener which minor suit she held.

Their NSW opponent Ruth Tobin had a huge hand:

AKQ3

♥AKQJT8

♦Κ

•Q5

She doubled; Therese bid 3♦ and Ruth's partner Anita (my wife) doubled (values). Ruth then had the challenge of what to bid next.

She bid a practical 5♥ and Anita raised to six.

At the other table, there was no pre-empt and the grand slam was bid.

The pre-empt was very successful!

However, if you are vulnerable and pre-empt on weak hands, you make it hard for partner to judge when to bid game and when to double the opponents.

What would you open in first seat at adverse vulnerable with:

- **♦**KT9643
- **♥**Q93
- **♦**3
- **♣**A53

Many players would open a multi $2 \bullet$ or $2 \bullet$. I prefer opening $1 \bullet$, as 6 of my points are outside my suit and I only have one of the top 4 honour cards in the suit.

Sartaj Han's rule for pre-empts: avoid pre-empting with a void.

He and I are in full agreement.
