

ANC 2026

The 2026 ANC will be held in Canberra from 4 July 2026 to 16 July 2026. The venue is the Canberra Labor Club in the Belconnen Town Centre. Attached to the Labor Club is the Mercure Hotel. There are 81 restaurants, a large shopping mall and a bus interchange, all within walking distance. There is a bus service between the airport and the Belconnen bus interchange, running approximately every 15 minutes.

The ANC will include the usual national Gold Point events: the Interstate Teams and Pairs, and the Open and Mixed Butler events. However, we would like to make the ANC an event that welcomes all players, especially those from the smaller and regional bridge clubs, not just the elite players from the big cities! So, accompanying the national events in 2026 will be several pairs and teams events open to all categories of players. We aim for the ANC to be an event where everyone can enjoy the bridge and make or renew friendships with other players from the region.

A particular feature of the ANC will be the Australian Country Championships, where teams representing the regional and/or smaller clubs compete in a three-day event. There is also a two-day pairs event for regional and country players.

Information about the ANC, the venue and local accommodation is already available in MyABF and in social media posts. Entries open on 1 January 2026. There will be a major junior soccer competition in Canberra in July 2026, which may mean that accommodation in Canberra will be in short supply. We encourage players to book their accommodation early, if possible by the end of November 2025.

The ANC will be convened by Lyn Carter and Cathy Nichols. We are pleased to advice that Laurie Kelso has accepted the role of Chief Tournament Director.



PARKING: Discounted parking is available at BTP for \$6.50 per week day. Weekend Parking is **FREE** For the discount rate download the **Parkable App** and set up an account and password.

Open the Parkable App, Tap the **Menu Button** (3 horizontal lines), Select **Voucher Codes**, Tap **Enter Voucher Code**, Input the code **BTP50%** The Voucher will be saved & only needs to be done once.

To Park: Sign in to the Parkable App, Start typing BTP Conference & Exhibition Centre 1 Clunies Ross Ct, Press the green building icon, Select your parking bay (purple, grey, green), Scroll down to see Map, Select Start Parking or Reserve Bay, Complete payment. Park in your assigned bay. Press **Stop Parking** to leave

a 15 minute walk.






WEEK DAYS ONLY OPTION - Bus Route 150, transfer to Bus Route 152

- Catch Bus Route 150 (see above) and get off at Macgregor Street Garden City Depot (the stop after Upper Mount Gravatt Bus Station (Garden City) Stay at the same bus stop and get on Bus Route 152 (leaves Garden City once an hour on weekdays. No night time service)
- Get off at Bus Stop 82 (Logan Road, near Miles Platting Road)
- Behind Bus Stop 82 take the path between the Mazda building and Quest Apartments to the front of Quest Apartments (1 Clunies Ross Court). The Convention Centre is visible from here.
- OR From Bus Stop 82, walk 100m south along Logan Road and use the concrete steps into the Convention Centre Car Park. Exit from the near end of the car park into Clunies Ross Court.

The Glen Hotel is at Stop 84 on Bus Route 152

The Mercure Hotel is at McGregor Street Garden City Depot Stop on Bus Route 152
